The Pact for Skills is gaining momentum

- 20 Large Scale Skills Partnerships now launched in all key industrial ecosystems: together, LSPs committed to provide up- and reskilling opportunities to over 25 million people by 2030.
- Focus on Regional level: Five regional partnerships launched

Key Achievements in 2022 and 2023

- 3.5 million people benefited from up- and reskilling activities
- 92,000 stakeholders were involved in collaboration with Pact members
- €310 million were invested into up- and reskilling activities
- 48,000 training courses were updated or developed



The Pact for Skills provides value to its members: results from the 2023 survey

Overall positive opinion on the Pact:

- More than two thirds of Pact for Skills respondents (71%) reported that the Pact for Skills is very or somewhat valuable to upskilling and reskilling opportunities.
- 94% of respondents reported contributing to at least one Pact principle
- Employers' organisations, public authorities and SMEs were the stakeholder types that found the Pact most valuable
- Main areas of added value were networking opportunities (93% found it useful) and access to knowledge, information and resources (78%)



Synergies between the Pact for Skills and EAfA

The Pact for Skills and the European Alliance for Apprenticeships (EAfA) present multiple possible areas for cooperation:

- Stakeholder engagement: similar membership, set up, and goals
- **Promoting collaboration**: large-scale and regional partnerships in the Pact and the Community of Practice under the EAfA aim to strengthen cooperation across <u>sectors and regions</u>.
- Knowledge sharing: both support members to build their knowledge and capacity
- Commitment to horizontal priorities: both initiatives contribute to the achievement of <u>broader EU</u>
 <u>priorities</u>
- **Examples of collaboration**: Dedicated session in the Pact for Skills Forum, webinar on building synergies with the EAfA (25 June); Pact for Skills and EAfA social media takeovers

- Founded in 2017, with the support of OBESSU, the YFJ and DG EMPL.
- The European Apprentices Network (EAN) is an important social partner on EU VET policy.
- The EAN has continuously pushed for formal representation of apprentices at the regional, national & European level, and will continue to do so, along with the right to fair working conditions and fair remuneration for apprentices.
- In the past year, the EAN has worked together with Ecorys to conduct research into the Mental Health and Wellbeing of apprentices over Europe.
- The research will be soon available, and we will disseminate it.
